## Wine-Tasting at Jackson (INN AT THORN HILL)

This high-quality inn has an exceptional wine cellar. All stays here include a short wine-tasting session exclusively for Inntravel guests with innkeeper Jim Cooper aimed at introducing you to some of the distinctive flavours of American wines.



## Birds of Coastal Maine (ULLIKANA)

Bald eagles, ospreys, peregrine falcons and great blue herons, plus a variety of shore birds, are some of the species you may spot on a private four-hour tour with naturalist Michael Good, whose speciality is the Acadia National Park's amazing birdlife. He is a truly inspirational guide, and will tailor the trips (approximately \$75) to your interests.

## White Mountain Gardens (NOTCHLAND INN)

Despite the White Mountains' harsh climate and rocky soil, the region boasts some outstanding gardens, not least those of the Notchland Inn, to which innkeeper Les Schoof will introduce you, sharing a few of the secrets of his success. You then independently tour three other, award-winning gardens, your souvenir booklet bringing them alive for you. For four tours you pay approximately \$22, including a picnic. Available until late September.



## The Natural World of Vermont (BLUEBERRY HILL INN)

Spend two hours visiting the Moosalamoo region and you will learn how it supports such a rich flora and fauna, from moose and black bears to peregrine falcons and ospreys. Your guide is Bruce Brown, field director of the conservation group of which innkeeper Tony Clark is president. They have so enhanced this tranquil area that it was a finalist in the 2004 World Legacy Awards. We ask that you donate a minimum of \$25 to the Moosalamoo Association.
